President's Message

Hi Everyone! Winter is certainly here!

All of our trips are full and our first western trip is about to depart!

It is forecasted to get bitterly cold next week. Please be prepared! If you chose to use an electric space heater: Please make sure it is in good condition and you follow it's manufactures instructions. Almost all electric space heaters are inherently dangerous, due to the amount of electrical current they demand. Each year many fires start as a result of an improper power supply/wiring, and not necessarily the heater itself! A few things you can do to minimize this risk are:

- 1. Make sure the circuit (not just the outlet) is not overloaded. Be particularly aware of other things that also produce heat (Hair dryer, curling iron, toaster, hotplate, etc.)
- 2. Plug the heater DIRECTLY into a FIRM (not a loose or damaged) outlet.
- 2b. Do NOT use an extension cord, power strip, surge protector, etc.
- 3. Use the lowest possible heat setting (avoid HIGH [1500 watts], unless absolutely necessary).
- 4. If your heater only has one heat setting, it's probably 1500 watts (same as HIGH on most units that have multiple settings), be VERY careful.
- 5. After the heater has been on for some time, feel the cord and the outlet it is plugged in to; if anything is hot (warm is normal), discontinue use until you find out why and correct issue.

Finland And Switzerland

Sunday, February 2, 2025 to Friday, February 14, 2025
In Search of the Northern Lights with post trip to Switzerland



In Finland, you can view nature's most spectacular light show, the Aurora Borealis, from purpose-built spaces like glass huts and luxury suites.

The Northern Lights are visible roughly 200 nights a year in Finnish Lapland? While many choose to go Aurora-spotting by snowshoe, ski, snowmobile or dog sled, you can also view the Northern Lights from the comfort of the indoors.

The nights are typically dark enough to see the Northern Lights from late August to April – all you need are clear skies and a bit of luck. Head north for the best chance of catching them.

Known as one of the cradles of skiing, the winter sports that we see today stem from the Jungfrau ski region. Wengen, for example, has been hosting ski races for over 100 years. The name of the region comes from the magnificent Jungfrau Mountain, the largest peak between itself and its neighbors: the Eiger and the Mönch. One of the major attractions to the ski region is the amazing off-piste area its slopes provide.

Jungfrau has three areas in one: Grindelwald-Wengen, Grindelwald-First and Mürren-Schilthorn. Altogether, the region consists of two valleys, three mountain ranges and 131 miles of skiable terrain. There's something for every level of skier, from gentle to steep slopes, plenty of powder, terrain parks and racing areas.
