Telluride Trip Report (Feb. 20-27, 2021)



Twelve brave LSSC skiers headed out to Telluride in the middle of the pandemic. It was a tough assignment—but somebody had to do it! Ten of us (Howard, Robin, Barbara, John, Declan, Hunter, John, Tammy, Jeff, and Kelly) flew out on Saturday, Feb. 20. We barely made it to the Montrose airport before it shut down for a couple of days due to a beacon malfunction. We got our rental cars and—after splitting up to test out both Montrose City Markets—headed to Telluride. Two cars made it there in good time while the third had a couple of important detours. We stayed at the Mountainside Inn, located a short walk away from the Coonskin lift and from downtown Telluride. There was a nice path from our hotel to downtown next to the San Miguel River—except for the night when it had iced over and we nearly slid into the river. The first night we got 5” of snow, our only fresh snow of the week, so skiing the next day was wonderful. We ate lunch that day and most days at the Gorrano Ranch on-mountain restaurant. Food had to be ordered and then they brought it to you—mainly outside, where most of the seating was. Terry and Bob arrived that night, after a difficult journey. With the Montrose airport closed, their flight was canceled and they had to take several flights

to get to Aspen, and then drive their rental car from Aspen to Telluride. We ate that night, and one other night, at Steamies Burger Bar. Kelly was our dinner organizer, and made reservations for the group at several excellent establishments: West End Bistro, Tomboy Tavern, and The Peaks. The skiing all week was excellent. There was great mogul skiing off of the Gold Hill, Plunge, and Apex lifts; excellent cruising off of the Village and Polar Queen lifts; and bowl skiing off of the Prospect Bowl and Revelation Bowl lifts (see map below). All in all, everyone enjoyed the great skiing, dining, and company that we had all week!
